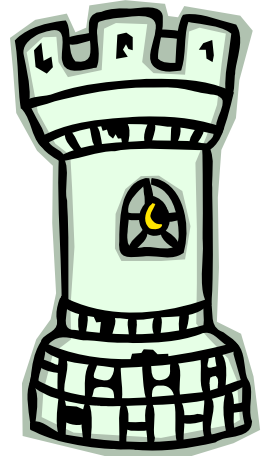


## Did you know Camelot Elementary is a School-wide Title I school?



### *What does Title I mean?*

Title I means that Camelot receives Federal Title I money for assistance to our students who are struggling with reading and math.

### *What does School-wide Title I mean?*

School-wide means that all of Camelot's students can be considered Title I students. It makes it easier to provide instruction for all students who are struggling.

### *What are Camelot's programs for students struggling in reading?*

Camelot has tutoring for students who are below standard in reading in grades K-2. These students meet one-to-one with specially trained para-professionals who tutor them in reading each day. In addition, Camelot has certificated teachers who meet with students who are below standard in reading. These teachers work with small groups of students.

### *What are Camelot's programs for students struggling in math?*

Camelot has a certificated teacher who supports students both in their classrooms and in small groups.

### *How are Camelot's Title I programs planned?*

Camelot has a School Leadership Team with both Camelot staff and Camelot parents. This team meets to look carefully at students' needs and plans Camelot's Title I program to meet those students' needs. In addition, this team helps to decide how to spend Camelot's parent involvement money – money designated for making it easier for parents to be informed in and involved with their students' educations. Camelot's Parent Involvement Plan and the Parent Teacher Student Compact are developed and approved by this committee as well.
