HUSKY PROMISE: The Husky Promise covers tuition and fees for academically qualified students who are eligible for a federal Pell Grant or Washington State Need Grant. A student's tuition will be covered first by federal and state grants. The university will then make up any difference with institutional grants or scholarship. Students' eligible for the Husky Promise must:

- ❖ Be admitted to any of the UW's three campuses;
- ❖ Enroll full-time at the UW (incoming freshmen, transfer students and current UW students are all eligible for the Husky Promise);
- ❖ Be a Washington state resident;
- ❖ Meet all eligibility criteria for the Pell Grant or State Need Grant Programs;
- ❖ Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) before the UW's priority filing date of February 28 for the following academic year; Be pursuing a first bachelor's degree;
- ❖ Maintain satisfactory academic progress while at the UW.
